Report of Joint Survey Committee on Senate Bill 480

Recommendation

It is the opinion of this committee that passage of this bill would be in the public interest, but that a substitute amendment should be adopted for the purpose of including within the Sheriffs' Annuity and Benefit Fund of Milwaukee County, and for the purpose of clarifying the language of certain portions of the bill; a substitute amendment for such purposes is hereby submitted by this committee.

It is also the opinion of this committee that Senate Bills 289 and 462 should not be acted upon by the legislature until this bill has either been passed or rejected; if this bill is passed, the problems presented in Senate Bills 289 and 462 can then be resolved by local action.
