To the Honorable, the Senate:

I return herewith **Senate Bill 393**.

The utilization of parking spaces around the Capitol Square is of concern to both the citizens of the State and the City of Madison. The limited parking area must serve persons who desire to visit the State Capitol or to shop in downtown businesses, state employees and officers and legislators. Certainly all of these interests must be taken into account in placing restrictions on the use of the Capitol parking area.

It is important that the legislators have adequate parking facilities available to them when the Legislature is in session. However, every attempt should be made to accomplish this without seriously affecting the available parking for those who visit the Capitol and downtown business vicinity.

I believe the parking problem for legislators and state officials during legislative sessions can be alleviated, through the cooperative efforts of the State and City. A recent meeting between legislative leaders, city officials and me was particularly encouraging in this respect. At my direction the Department of Administration and the Highway Commission are presently conducting a joint study of the parking problem. This study should be completed by next October.

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Some progress has already been made. The parking situation was noticeably improved during the last week of the legislative session after permits for parking on the Capitol grounds for more than thirty state employees were restricted to use only on days the Legislature is not in session.

I suggested that the bill be withdrawn for consideration after a further study was made, but this was not done. I feel it is preferable to delay any final action until the study of the problem is complete. It is my opinion that every effort should be made to resolve this problem in cooperation with the city officials, and I am therefore returning this bill without my approval.
