CHAPTER 70, LAWS OF 1967

AN ACT to grant to the city of Racine, 3 parcels of partly submerged land constituting a part of the bed of Lake Michigan.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

There is hereby granted and ceded to the city of Racine, to be used for public docks, wharves, highways, harbor protection, water recreation, public park and boulevard and related purposes, all the right, title and interest of this state in and to the following described 3 parcels of partly submerged land lying along and adjacent to the shore of Lake Michigan, constituting a part of the bed of Lake Michigan on the eastern boundary of said city of Racine, namely:

PARCEL NO. 1. A strip of partly submerged land, constituting a part of the bed of Lake Michigan, on the easterly boundary of the city of Racine, the northerly boundary of which is the centerline of Twelfth

Street extended; the westerly boundary of which is the shore; the southerly boundary of which is the north line of Twenty-first Street extended; and the easterly boundary of which is a straight line 1150 feet east of, and parallel to, the east line of South Main Street, and its southerly extension.

PARCEL NO. 2. A strip of partly submerged land, constituting a part of the bed of Lake Michigan, on the easterly boundary of the city of Racine, the northly boundary of which is the north line of Yout Street extended; the westerly boundary of which is the shore; the southerly boundary of which is the north breakwater of Racine Harbor; and the easterly boundary of which is a straight line, 1300 feet east of, and parallel to, the east line of Michigan Boulevard.

PARCEL NO. 3. A strip of partly submerged land, constituting a part of the bed of Lake Michigan, on the easterly boundary of the city of Racine, the northerly boundary of which is the centerline of Melvin Avenue extended; the westerly boundary of which is the shore; the southerly boundary of which is the north line of Yout Street extended; and the easterly boundary of which is a straight line, the northerly end of which is 1150 feet east of the east line of Michigan Boulevard, measured along the extended centerline of Melvin Avenue, and the southerly end of which is 1300 feet east of the east line of Michigan Boulevard, measured along the extended north line of Yout Street.
