I have returned to you Assembly Bill 834 without my approval.

Bill 834, A, and 495, S, both provide the same appropriation to continue the operation of Camp Gordon for fiscal years 1967-1968 and 1968-1969

Since I have signed 495, S, into law, this bill must be vetoed in order to avoid a double appropriation to continue the camp's operation.

To the Honorable, the Assembly:

I have signed Assembly Bill 1077 and deposited it in the office of the Secretary of State.

However, in approving this bill I have item vetoed that portion which appropriated funds for this scholarship program from the higher educational aids provided under section 20.415, Wisconsin Statutes.

It would appear that the provisions of this bill could not be financed under this procedure since no collateral would be available to enable the Wisconsin Investment Board to provide the necessary funds for the loans.

This alternative means of financing was adopted by an amendment to the original bill and I am compelled to remove it so that this program can be instituted as intended by the Legislature.
