ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 19

Requesting an opinion of the attorney general as to the effect of language in **Assembly Joint Resolution 1**.

*Resolved by the assembly*, That the attorney general is requested to render an opinion to the assembly at an early date in regard to the effect of language set forth on page 2, lines 17 to 26, and continued on page 3, lines 1 to 14, of **Assembly Joint Resolution 1**, so as to indicate whether the language therein does in fact express the initial intent of the legislature that said proposal shall limit state borrowing to an overall total of 5% of the aggregate value of all taxable property in the state less certain exclusions, and to an annual ceiling of  $\frac{3}{4}$  of 1% of the aggregate value of all taxable property in the state.
