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RESOLUTION

**Assembly Resolution 21**

Requesting the department of administration to report to the assembly on savings realized and costs incurred as the result of the 1967 reorganization act.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This resolution requests the department of administration to report by March 1, 1969, to the assembly on the status of the executive branch reorganization resulting from the 1967 reorganization act (chapter 75, laws of 1967), indicating savings realized and costs incurred as the result thereof.

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Whereas, the department of administration, previous to the legislature's voting on the 1967 reorganization act, issued news releases indicating that enactment would save the state between \$3,000,000 and \$15,000,000; and

Whereas, the department of administration claimed that enactment would retard the growth of the executive branch and would result in increased efficiency of state government; and

Whereas, the act has now been in effect for 18 months—a sufficient period of time to warrant a review to determine whether these savings in money and manpower are actually being realized; now, therefore, be it

*Resolved by the assembly,* That the assembly requests the department of administration to report no later than March 1, 1969, to the assembly on the status of the executive branch reorganization which has resulted from chapter 75, laws of 1967, indicating specifically the savings realized and costs incurred as the result of that reorganization.
