RESOLUTION

Assembly Resolution 26

Urging the U.S. secretary of agriculture to hike milk price support.

Whereas, farmers have become accustomed to receiving 50% advanced payments under the federal feed and grain program; and

Whereas, this year such payments are increasingly necessary to grapple with the high cost of operations and to pay skyrocketing property taxes in Wisconsin; and

Whereas, under present law the secretary of agriculture is authorized to, of his own volition, raise milk price supports to a full 90% of parity; and

Whereas, milk price supports are presently equivalent to 87% of parity; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the assembly of the state of Wisconsin, That the secretary of agriculture Clifford Hardin is hereby commended for setting 50% advance payments under the federal grain program; and, be it further

Resolved, That the secretary of agriculture is urged at the earliest possible date to raise milk price support to 90% of parity, the highest level allowed under present law.
