RESOLUTION

**Assembly Resolution 27**

Relating to North Central Airlines proposed service.

Whereas, the state of Wisconsin, generally, and Milwaukee and other communities particularly in northern Wisconsin have received inadequate air service for the past decade; and

Whereas, the lack of adequate air service has forced many Wisconsin air passengers to travel by surface means to Chicago's O'Hare Field to secure needed air service at great expense and inconvenience; and

Whereas, many other Wisconsin air passengers are forced to make time consuming and inconvenient connections at Chicago's congested O'Hare Field in order to reach their final destinations; and

Whereas, the Civil Aeronautics Board instituted the Twin Cities-Milwaukee Long-Haul Investigation, the Milwaukee Short-Haul Investigation and Twin Cities-Milwaukee Southeast Points Investigation for the purpose of improving Wisconsin's air service and developing Milwaukee as an air traffic hub in its own right, while at the same time, reducing the congestion at Chicago's O'Hare Field; and, whereas, North Central Airlines and other carriers have applied for authority for expanded service; now, therefore, be it

*Resolved by the assembly,* That the legislature of the state of Wisconsin commends the Civil Aeronautics Board for instituting these proceedings and supports the Wisconsin Department of Justice, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Milwaukee County and other Wisconsin communities in their efforts to secure improved air transportation for the state of Wisconsin.
