DISTINGUISHED GUEST

The speaker requested Assemblyman Sweda to conduct the former gentleman from Marathon 2nd, now Congressman David R. Obey, representing the 7th Congressional District, to the podium. On his approach to the front of the chamber and mounting the podium platform, the members honored Congressman Obey by giving him a standing ovation. His address to the assembly traced a career in the body which started seven years ago, expressed regret at terminating his status as an assemblyman and the hope that in Washington, he can be the personal congressman for all present. On leaving the podium, Congressman Obey was given a second standing ovation. The speaker's response to the distinguished visitor's appearance and speech was acknowledged by prolonged applause on the part of the entire membership.

DISTINGUISHED VISITORS FROM GERMANY

The assembly was honored today by the visit of two gentlemen from the Republic of West Germany, each one prominent in his own environment.

The Honorable Friedrich Karl Storm, member of the Bundestag, (House of Representatives) of West Germany representing the state of Schleswig-Holstein as a member of the Christian Democratic Union Party in the West German parliament. He has been a visitor to the United States previously.

The other gentleman, Mr. Wulf Garthe, from Hamburg, Germany, assistant director of, and representing the Central Pommerianian Society, an organization devoted to promulgating cultural relations.

The two gentlemen are in Wisconsin this week cooperating with the State Historical Society of Wisconsin on exploring the possibility of a cultural exchange program between West Germany and Wisconsin.

They will visit the proposed Old World Wisconsin historic site in the southern Kettle Moraine State Forest and also examples of century-old immigrant half-timber houses in several counties. This morning they presented greetings from the Republic of West Germany to Governor Knowles.
