### **Assembly Resolution 34**

*Resolved by the assembly,* That the attorney general is requested to render an opinion as expeditiously as possible as to whether article IV, section 4 of the Wisconsin constitution must be presently interpreted as prohibiting assembly districts from crossing county lines in accordance with the holding in *State ex rel. Atty. Gen. v. Cunningham* (1892) 81 Wis. 440, in view of the facts that prior to 1892 Wisconsin assembly districts did cross county lines, that under present adherence to county lines Wisconsin has an assembly district which is 32.5% above the average and another which is 43.7% below the average and that the U.S. supreme court in *Kirkpatrick v. Preisler* (1969) has voided a congressional apportionment in which the maximum deviation from the norm was 3.13%.
