RULING OF THE CHAIR ON POINT OF ORDER RAISED  
ON APRIL 9, 1969, AS TO GERMANENESS OF  
ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1, TO  
ASSEMBLY BILL 94

**Assembly Bill 94** repeals 255.04 (2) (B) by striking out "in counties where the total number of branches of circuit and county courts exceeds 10, there shall be 2 master tumblers, one for civil actions, including ordinance and forfeiture violations, and one for criminal actions which tumblers shall be cared for as provided in subdivision 1."

Assembly amendment 1 affects 255.04 (2) (a) and changes the number of names to be drawn from not less than 300 or more than 500 to not less than 300 or more than 1500, and when the list is depleted, additional names shall be furnished so at no time is there less than 150 or more than 1500 to draw from.

Assembly amendment 1 to **Assembly Bill 94** cannot be considered germane.

(1) General Statement

The bill provides for 1 master tumbler instead of 2.

The amendment deals with the number of names in each tumbler and *accomplishes a different purpose.*

(2) A

It is actually a case of *one individual proposition amending another individual proposition*, and should actually be accomplished either by a bill covering both areas or two separate bills.
