Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This proposal creates 11 assembly standing committees, the members of which shall serve on the respective joint standing committee. The number of members on 9 of the

committees shall be determined by the speaker but shall not be less than 5 nor more than 13. The finance committee shall consist of 9 assemblymen. The operations board shall consist of 5 members serving ex officio.

Each committee shall reflect the political composition of each house and no member shall serve on less than one nor more than 2 committees. The speaker shall appoint the majority party members of each committee and the minority leader shall appoint the minority party members.

Resolved by the assembly, That Assembly Rule 20 is repealed and recreated to read:

ASSEMBLY RULE 20. STANDING COMMITTEES. (1) The following assembly standing committees shall be selected as near the commencement of the first session of each newly elected legislature as possible:

(a) Finance. The finance committee shall consist of 9 assemblymen.

(b) Governmental and military affairs.

(c) Judiciary.

(d) Commerce.

(e) Transportation.

(f) Agriculture and consumer services.

(g) Natural resources.

(h) Health and social services.

(i) Human resources.

(j) Education.

(k) Assembly operations board. The board shall consist of the speaker, the majority leader, the minority leader, the assistant majority leader and the assistant minority leader.

(2) The members of the assembly committees in sub. (1) shall be the assembly members of the respective joint committees of the legislature.

(3) Each standing committee of the assembly shall reflect, as close as possible and with fractions resolved in favor of the majority party, the political composition of the assembly, but each assemblyman shall serve on at least one standing committee of the assembly and no assemblyman shall serve on more than 2 standing committees of the assembly.

(4) The number of members on each committee under

sub. (1) (b) to (j) shall be determined by the speaker, but shall not be less than 3 nor more than 13.

(5) The speaker shall appoint the majority party members of each assembly committee. The minority leader shall appoint the minority party members of each assembly committee.

This was the first time production of a woody plant was accomplished by tissue culture. The achievement marked the culmination of 6 years of intensive scientific work. And,

Whereas, plant physiologists have known for sometime that the hormones "auxin" and "cytokinin" are responsible, respectively, for growth and cellular differentiation in various plant tissues. Tissue culture development of herbaceous plants had already been achieved in laboratories, but Dr. Winton's success marks the first scientific breakthrough in the quest for laboratory development of woody plants; now, therefore,
