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## RESOLUTIONS

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#### **Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau**

This resolution creates an assembly rule under which committee reports would not be read but instead the information as reported by the committee would be printed in the journal.

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*Resolved by the assembly, That assembly rule 16c is created to read:*

Assembly Rule 16c. *PRINTING COMMITTEE REPORTS.* Committee reports shall not be read to the assembly but shall be printed in the journal in the form in which they are received from the committees.

### **Assembly Resolution 45**

To amend assembly rule 26 (1), relating to motions to withdraw bills from committees.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This resolution would allow the assembly to vote on a motion to withdraw a bill from committee only once every 21 calendar days.

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*Resolved by the assembly, That assembly rule 26 (1) is amended to read:*

Assembly Rule 26 (1) After 21 calendar days, if the committee has not reported a proposal to the assembly, the assembly may by a majority vote of the members present withdraw such proposal from the committee. *The assembly may vote on a motion to withdraw such a proposal from committee only once every 21 calendar days.*

**Assembly Resolution 46**

Requesting an opinion of the attorney general as to the constitutionality of Senate Bill 45.
