RESOLUTIONS

Assembly Resolution 48

To repeal and recreate assembly rule 43 to require that petitions be printed in the journal but not be read to the assembly by the chief clerk.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This resolution creates a rule for petitions to the assembly different from the rule for other papers and communications. The latter will still be read by the chief clerk but information regarding the petitions will not be read but instead will be printed in the journal as a matter of course.

Resolved by the assembly, That assembly rule 43 is repealed and recreated to read:

RULE 43. PETITIONS, COMMUNICATIONS AND OTHER PAPERS DIRECTED TO THE ATTENTION OF THE ASSEMBLY.

(1) All petitions presented to the assembly shall be delivered to the chief clerk and shall be printed in the journal

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by number, stating the subject matter of the petition, the name of the member by whom it was introduced and the name of the communicating person or organization. The presiding officer may refer them to a committee for disposition.

(2) All other papers presented to the assembly shall be delivered to the chief clerk who shall state the subject matter of such papers and the name of the member by whom it was introduced and the name of the communicating person or organization. The presiding officer may refer the same to a committee for disposition. All communications among such papers may be printed in the journal when so directed by the presiding officer or by order of the assembly.
