1969 REPORT OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE FOR THE
REVIEW OF ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

For the years 1967-1968

To: The Honorable Governor Warren P. Knowles
The Honorable, the Senate and Assembly of Wisconsin

At a meeting held on November 8, 1967 the Committee elected Assemblyman Shabaz as chairman, Assemblyman Thompson as vice-chairman and Assemblyman Pabst as secretary.

At a public hearing held on December 28, 1967 the Committee heard the following complaints and took the following action:

1. Complaint by H. E. Halvorson, representing the Retail Gasoline Dealers Assn., that the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations had adopted a rule authorizing self-service gasoline pumps without adequate notice of hearing and without adequate consideration of the problems involved. The department listed the hearings which had been held and the notices given. The Committee unanimously voted to request the department to hold another public hearing after publication of a new notice in the Administrative Register.

2. Complaint by Jared Lobdell that the Investment Board was not making proper use of the investment directors in the investment of state funds. No administrative rule covering the matter was cited to the Committee. The Executive Director of the Investment Board stated that he was resigning as of February 1, 1968. The Committee took no action because no administrative rule was involved.

3. Complaint that farm machinery travel on an interchange at Highways I-94 and 11 is barred by rule Hwy 30.01 (3) (e) 22. Farmers should be granted permits to

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move their equipment through the interchange. After listening to complainants and representatives of the department, the committee tabled the complaint for future consideration.
