EXECUTIVE COMMUNICATIONS

August 7, 1969.

To the Honorable, the Senate:

The following bill, originating in the Senate, has been approved in part (Chapter 141) and vetoed in part and deposited in the office of the Secretary of State.

Senate Bill 280 will greatly assist statewide efforts to control one of the most vicious and disabilitating of criminal activities in our state: drug abuse. I strongly favor this legislation and urge the Department of Justice to begin implementation of its provisions as soon as possible.

I have, consistent with announced fiscal policy, line item vetoed the appropriation sections of the bill. The Conference Committee has approved financing of this bill in their deliberations at approximately the level suggested in my Executive Budget. I am confident that subsequent action by the Legislature will recognize the importance of funding this vital law enforcement activity.
