Public Policy Involved

This bill is desirable as public policy. Amateur radio

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equipment and household equipment such as bench saws, lawn mowers, etc. are basically similar to other personal items in this section, for instance bicycles, firearms, etc. Generally, household equipment is excluded defacto from taxation. Its detection by an assessor is difficult and, in the aggregate, its value of slight significance. It is basically similar to other household items exempted and should be added to the list of property legally recognized as outside personal property taxation.
