##### **Recommendation**

This senate joint resolution amends the State Constitution and thus corrects an inequity that presently exists regarding the treatment of retired state and municipal employees. It is the opinion of this committee that the adoption of this resolution is in the best public interest.

## **APPENDIX TO 1971 SENATE BILL 19**

### **Recommendation**

This bill allows a member, who has moved or will move from one state supported retirement system to another, to transfer his retirement credit and benefits. It provides retirement benefits for participants as though such participants had remained in one state supported system, rather than two or more, until retirement. An intrastate reciprocity program has been critically needed in this state for over two decades.

Twenty six states have presently implemented a program of intrastate reciprocity. It is advantageous to the State in its role as a recruiter and employer as well as to the members of the retirement systems involved. The expense of establishing retroactive reciprocity appears quite small, while the expense of contemporary reciprocity, for all practical purposes, is non-existent.

For the above reasons it is the opinion of this Committee that this bill is definitely in the best public interest and is deserving of passage.
