The proposed new assembly rule would prohibit all persons from smoking in the assembly chamber.

Assembly Rule 13m. **Smoking Prohibited.** While the assembly is in session, no person shall smoke on the floor of the assembly chamber or in the observers' galleries connected with the assembly chamber.

When installed, the chief clerk shall activate the buzzer everytime a call of the roll, or roll call vote, is ordered in the assembly. The chief clerk shall not close the roll on the assembly roll call machine for a time of 5 minutes from the sounding of the buzzer unless the voting display board indicates that all members have voted excepting those members granted a leave of absence for the balance of that day's session.

The proposed new assembly rule would require the speaker to so assign seats to the members of the assembly that all smoking representatives are assigned seats around the periphery of the chamber.

Assembly Rule 13m. Assigning seats to smokers. As soon as practicable near the commencement of the session, all members of the assembly shall notify the speaker whether they are smokers or nonsmokers. The speaker shall so assign the seats that the seats around the periphery of the chamber are assigned to smokers.
