Whereas, the Milwaukee Sentinel newspaper has conducted an investigation of the Milwaukee county welfare department during the past 3 months with their findings being published at the present time; and

Whereas, this investigation has uncovered a great amount of fraud and waste among the welfare recipients and within the department itself; and

Whereas, the investigation discovered as much as 20% of the annual budget of \$151.5 million being lost to fraud and administrative error, totaling some \$28 million last year; and

Whereas, the welfare department has not done an adequate job of checking out the information supplied by the welfare applicants, a practice which results in many persons receiving welfare benefits without meeting the necessary qualifications; and

Whereas, it is in the best interests of all taxpayers that such fraud and waste be systematically uncovered and eliminated as soon as possible; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the assembly, that the assembly health and social services committee undertake an immediate, full-scale investigation into the practices of the Milwaukee county welfare department using all powers granted the committee under chapter 13 of the statutes, including the power to subpoena witnesses, to bring an immediate resolution to the problems of waste and fraud.
