INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

Senate Resolution 39

Requesting an attorney general's opinion on the use by the department of natural resources of moneys appropriated for lake rehabilitation, preservation and maintenance of scenic and wild rivers, lake survey and classification, artificial lake creation and Wolf river preservation on a fish toxicant program on the Rock river.

Resolved by the senate, That the attorney general is requested to provide the senate with his formal written opinion as to whether the department of natural resources improperly used moneys appropriated under section 20.370 (1) (e) of the statutes for lake rehabilitation, preservation and maintenance of scenic and wild rivers, lake survey and classification, artificial lake creation and Wolf river preservation on a fish toxicant program on the Rock river, and if so, whether such use was a violation of section 20.903 of the statutes.
