Dear Mr. Bolle:

In reply to your letter of February 26, 1976, asking whether a state-union contract permitting five state employes to work as fulltime, state paid, union directed grievance representatives is constitutional and legal, I regret that this office may not express an opinion. It has been office policy for many years not to give advice regarding matters in litigation.

The precise question posed in the opinion request is currently being litigated in Circuit Court for Dane County, Case No. 149-300, James H. Knox v. Robert Dunn. et al. The briefs on defendant's demurrer have been submitted and the decision will probably be made within the next 90 days.

Enclosed for your information are copies of the brief of defendant and reply brief of defendant.

GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGES

April 1, 1976

To the Honorable, the Assembly:

I have approved Assembly Bill 481 as Chapter 189, Laws of 1975, and deposited it in the office of the Secretary of State.

I have exercised the partial veto power in two instances. First, Section 84 of the bill amends budget language concerning appeals by school districts from cost control spending limitations. As the budget currently reads, appeals are permitted in the event that cost controls "prevent the full implementation of a comprehensive plan to eliminate racial imbalance in the school district by a stated date."

The amendment in Assembly Bill 481 has the effect of limiting cost control appeals to those desegregation plans which are approved by the school board. In some instances, such as a desegregation order from a court, it may well be that a plan to eliminate racial imbalance will be imposed on a school district without the approval of the school board. Such a plan would nonetheless constitute a valid appeal from the cost control limitation. I have therefore deleted the requirement that the appeal apply only to desegregation plans approved by a school board.

Section 95m of the bill amends statutory language passed earlier this year relating to the use of flashing red lights and school bus markings. The present law permits the use of flashing red lights and school bus markings when a school bus is "transporting children for any purpose." Assembly Bill 481 amends the current

language so that red lights and markings can be used only when a school bus is carrying <u>only</u> children. If <u>any</u> adults were present in the bus, then flashing red lights and school bus markings could not be used.

For example, the presence of chaperones on a school bus transporting children would preclude the use of flashing red lights and school bus markings. I have deleted the word "only" from the bill so that school buses which transport children would be able to take safety measures even though some adults may be present.
