POINT OF ORDER

Representative Thompson rose to the point of order that assembly substitute amendment 1 to **Senate Bill 6**, June 1976 Special Session was not germane pursuant to Assembly Rule 57(1), relating to the order in which amendments are considered.

The speaker ruled as follows: "Until the second sentence of subparagraph 1 of Assembly Rule 57 was adopted there never was any confusion about the order of consideration. You always considered substitute amendments in inverse order no matter how many of them there were. If there were seven or eight substitute amendments and one was introduced after you had begun consideration of previous ones the one with the highest number was immediately considered. The chair personally would prefer that rule. However, that is not what the rule says now.

A change was adopted for which I can see the rationale, although I cannot agree with it, and that is the sentence that we're talking about.

In the opinion of the chair the only way in which this can be sensibly interpreted is the interpretation that I discussed with the gentleman from the 79th and urged by the lady from the 50th that it should be considered in numerical order because we had embarked upon consideration of the bill itself. Therefore, the substitute will be considered in the order in which it was introduced, that is, considered in the order of introduction. The chair interprets that literally, in order of introduction, and it's treated as a simple amendment except that when the question is put it will be on the substitute."
