It is the sense of the senate that no member, appointed by the senate to represent it on any senate or joint standing, special or select committee or on any conference committee, shall knowingly participate in any meeting of members of such committee, whether formal or informal, from which the remaining members of the committee and the public have been excluded if the activities at such meetings substantially predetermine the outcome of any vote or action subsequently to be taken by the committee; and

Be it further resolved, That: if any member of the senate finds himself or herself present at such a meeting the member shall inform those present that the activity is in violation of the law. Unless the objectionable activity is discontinued immediately, the member shall leave that meeting and shall forthwith report the occurrence to the committee on senate organization for investigation.
