A Proclamation

I, Patrick J. Lucey, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, under and by virtue of Section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, which provides that the Governor shall have the power to convene the Legislature on extraordinary occasions, do issue this, my proclamation, convening the Legislature of the State at the seat of government at Madison, on the eighteenth day of May, A.D., 1976, at ten o'clock, solely for the purpose of considering and acting upon the following subject of legislative business, to wit:

To provide for various changes in the Unemployment Compensation Law.
