A Proclamation

I, Patrick J. Lucey, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, under and by virtue of Section 4 of Articl V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, which provides that the Governor shall have the power to convene the Legislature on extraordinary occassions, do issue this, my proclamation, convening the Legislature of the State at the seat of government at Madison, on the fifteenth day of June, A.D., 1976, at ten o'clock a.m., solely for the purpose of considering and acting upon the following specific subjects of legislative business, to-wit:

- 1. To provide for changes in the law relating to open meetings of governmental bodies and notice of collective bargaining negotiations and providing penalties.
- 2. To provide for the revision of the alcoholism and intoxication treatment act and providing penalties.
- 3. To provide for an immunization program for the prevention of A/New Jersey and A/Victoria influenza and making appropriations.

- 4. To provide for changes in the law relating to the regulation of nursing homes, granting rule-making authority and providing penalties.
- 5. To provide for changes in the law relating to transportation by motor vehicle of persons having a handicap to or from training, rehabilitation or educational programs.
- 6. To provide for changes in the law relating to municipal utility relocation in connection with freeway condemnation and to treatment of the influence of prospective condemnation or valuation in eminent domain procedures.
- 7. To provide for the recodification of the Mental Health Act and making appropriations.
- 8. To provide for the adjustment of the appropriation from the general fund to the Municipal and County Shared Tax Account in connection with calendar year 1976 payments.
- 9. To provide for an increase in the allowable number of members of property assessment boards of review, as well as for a reduction in the number of members necessary to hold hearings of evidence, and to stipulate the procedures which must be followed before members not in attendance at hearings of evidence are allowed to participate in a decision on an appealed assessment.

10. To provide for modification of laws relating to expenditure and contribution limits in connection with campaigns for elective office and to allow for taxpayer designation of funds to be used to partially finance certain general election campaigns for elective office.

A Proclamation

- I, Patrick J. Lucey, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, under and by virtue of Section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, which provides that the Governor shall have the power to convene the Legislature on extraordinary occasions, do issue this, my proclamation expanding the purpose for which the Legislature of the state shall convene at the seat of government at Madison, on the fifteenth day of June, A.D., 1976, at ten o'clock a.m., to include, along with the consideration of the legislative business specified in my proclamation of the second day of June, A.D., 1976, the following subjects of legislative business, to-wit:
 - 1. To provide for creating a council on migrant labor, granting rule-making authority and providing penalties.
 - To provide for ratification of the agreement negotiated between the State of Wisconsin and the Wisconsin State Attorneys Association and authorizing an expenditure of funds.

3. To provide changes in the law relating to campaign financing, creating a clean election campaign fund, making appropriations and providing a penalty. (This item supercedes item 10 of the original special session proclamation issued June 2, 1976.)
