REPORT OF JOINT SURVEY COMMITTEE ON RETIREMENT SYSTEMS

Appendix to Senate Bill 235

Recommendation

Since 1948 the state legislature has reflected a continuing policy as to the consolidation and merger of retirement funds and as to providing uniformity in benefits, rights, and obligations for the

funds administered by the state. However, W.S. Chapter 111 permits bargaining on retirement matters for certain state employee groups which represent only 15% of the total participation under the statewide funds. Such bargaining could nullify the legislative policies of merger and uniformity. Senate Bill 235 would delete bargaining on retirement matters from provisions of W.S. Chapter 111. The Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems recognizes the many potential problems and unanswered questions relative to bargaining on retirement matters by individual bargaining units within a statewide retirement fund. Therefore, this committee finds that Senate Bill 235 is in the best interest of all parties involved and recommends passage of the bill.
