Senator Cullen raised the point of order that Senate Bill 225 should be considered at this time because of the majority vote to withdraw from the joint committee on Finance.

The chair ruled the point of order not well taken as a motion to withdraw and consider for action requires a suspension of the rules which requires a two-thirds vote.
