THEREFORE, I, Martin J. Schreiber, Acting Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim Thursday, November 10, 1977 as

UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS DAY

in Wisconsin and I urge all citizens of Wisconsin to pay tribute to all our marine men and women and realize how much they have done to keep our country a free and safe place for us to live.
