**CHAPTER 217, Laws of 1979**

AN ACT relating to conveying certain submerged lands to the city of Kewaunee.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

**SECTION 1. Grant.** The state of Wisconsin cedes, grants and conveys to the city of Kewaunee, a municipal corporation, all rights, title and interest to all of the land and any part or parcel of the lands described under SECTION 2 of this act to be held and used by

the city for dredge spoil containment and for future development for public slips, basins, docks, wharves, structures, wildlife refuges, recreation or park purposes.

**SECTION 2. Description.** The lands granted to the city of Kewaunee under this act include submerged lands under the waters of Lake Michigan and any dry lands which exist or may be created and are described as follows:

A tract of submerged lands being a part of the bed of Lake Michigan adjacent to Section 17, Township 23 North, Range 25 East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, in the city of Kewaunee, Kewaunee county, Wisconsin, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of a line 220 feet southerly of and parallel with the south line of Government Lot 1 of Section 17 and the ordinary high water mark of Lake Michigan; thence east along this line 220 feet southerly of and parallel with the south line of Government Lot 1 to a point on a line 3,000 feet easterly of and parallel with the west line of Section 17; thence south along this line 3,000 feet easterly of and parallel with the west line of Section 17 a distance of 2,110 feet to a point on a line 1,000 feet southerly of and parallel with the south line of Government Lot 2 of Section 17; thence west along this line 1,000 feet southerly of and parallel with the south line of Government Lot 2 to a point on the southwesterly line of the U.S. Government North breakwater structure; thence northwesterly along this southwesterly line of the breakwater structure to the ordinary high water mark of Lake Michigan, thence northerly along the ordinary high water mark of Lake Michigan to the point of beginning, containing 66.18 acres, more or less.
