REPORT OF JOINT SURVEY COMMITTEE ON DEBT MANAGEMENT

Appendix to Senate Bill 5, Special Session

Public Policy Involved

Senate Bill 5, Special Session is desirable as a matter of public policy, with the following changes:

- 1. The bill should be amended to provide definitions of terms such as adjusted gross "income" and "funds", and in developing such definitions, the Legislature should consider the definitions of such terms in statutes and administrative rules relating to the Veterans Housing Loan Program.
- 2.(a) The proposed priorities and the prohibition on loans for purchases of mobile homes contained in s. 234.045 (3), Wis. Stats., as created by SECTION 5, should be deleted.
- (b) There should be no such priorities in the operation of the program, which should be administered in the same manner as the Veterans Housing Loan Program.
- (c) The prohibition against refinancing contained in s. 234.045 (1) (e), Wis. Stats., as created by SECTION 5, should be amended to provide that refinancing is permitted if necessary to prevent the loss of the home through legal action.

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3. The content of assembly amendment 1 to Senate Bill 5, Special Session should be adopted as an amendment to this bill by the Legislature.

In addition, the program should not be expanded to include twofamily dwellings, such as is proposed in assembly amendment 2 to Assembly Bill 5, Special Session.
