Appendix to **Senate Bill 418**

Public Policy Involved

This bill has been recommended by the Claims Board as settlement for an alleged commitment made by the Board of Regents for a deferred unfunded retirement benefit. The Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems finds that such commitments are poor public policy and violate every principle of sound retirement planning. Specifically, the committee notes that the concept of an administrative agency making such a long-range unfunded commitment is poor public policy. We recognize, however, the prime responsibility of the Claims Board to negotiate settlements of such cases. We also recognize the legal and constitutional issues involved, and an Attorney General's opinion has been requested.
