#### Public Policy Involved

The proposal is not appropriate as a matter of public policy.

The Joint Survey Committee on Debt Management, on March 10, 1981, unanimously adopted a report, State Debt Policies, which stated at page 3, that the Joint Committee: "...based on the current state of the economy believes that it is prudent to issue no more than \$200 million per fiscal year of state general obligations." The committee also adopted criteria for reviewing proposals which would use the state general obligation bonding authority. The Committee has established a lower priority for use of general obligation bonding for the benefit of categories of individuals such as farmers, senior citizens, students and veterans than for construction or maintenance of state-owned capital facilities which benefit all citizens and capital costs associated with facilities that are not utilized or owned by the state, but which have a state-wide benefit to all citizens, such as water pollution abatement programs and transportation programs.

Assembly substitute amendment 1 to Assembly Bill 66 (Biennial Budget) currently contains \$160 million in general obligation bonding for point source pollution abatement facilities, \$10.9 million for ORAP 2000 general obligation bonding, \$2 million for Department of Transportation harbor acquisition and \$140 million general obligation bonding for the state building program. If bonding for all these programs is issued in the 1981-83 biennium, along with the remaining \$78 million in general obligation bonding for point source pollution abatement facilities, the total, \$390.9 million, would be slightly less than the total, \$400 million, recommended limit for general obligation bonding in 1981-83 biennium. This amount, however, does not include any amounts that the Legislature may subsequently approve in general obligation bonding for bridges or highways. Thus, it appears that the limit may be exceeded even without any issuance of general obligation bonds for veterans programs.

It should also be noted that as currently enacted, the Mortgage Subsidy Bond Tax Act of 1980 (P.L. 96-499) permits revenue obligations to be issued until December 31, 1983. After that date, unless the legislation is subsequently amended, mortgage subsidy bonds for single-family dwellings will no longer be tax exempt. General obligation bonds for veterans programs will be exempt from this restriction. Thus, it appears that under the current law, it is not

#### Public Policy Involved

The Committee takes no position on the desirability of this proposal as a matter of public policy, since a motion to recommend the proposal as desirable failed to be adopted on a tie vote of 4 to 4.

If the substitute amendment (LRB 0256/1) is to be adopted, it should be amended by substituting "may" for "shall" on page 9, line 3, and inserting "only" after "loans" on page 9, line 5.

The Mortgage Subsidy Bond Tax Act of 1980 (P.L. 96-499, approved December 5, 1980; also known as the "Ullman Act") places a ceiling on the amount of tax-exempt housing subsidy bonds that may be issued for owner-occupied one-to-four-unit houses. Tax exempt bonds for such housing will be eliminated at the end of 1983 under the Act.

The amount of bonding for all housing purposes which can be issued in Wisconsin is \$200,000,000. This limit includes moneys issued for housing rehabilitation by the Department of Development, veterans housing loans funded through revenue obligations issued by the State Building Commission and any bonding issued under this legislation. It would also include any local housing issues.
