The senate met.

The senate was called to order by the president of the senate.

Relating to soil and water conservation aids, Stonefield village, aid to families with dependent children, financing of minimum maintenance and health and safety projects, Milwaukee state office building space rental changes, temporary reallocation of state balances, special school adjustment aid, school cost controls, school of veterinary medicine funding, shared revenue, medical assistance, gift and estate tax exemption for interspousal transfers, adjustment of basis, community aids, elderly and handicapped transportation

Ordered to a third reading.
