Transmitted herewith is the 1979-81 biennial report of the Department of Employe Trust Funds.

The employe benefit trust funds administered by the department are designed to aid both state and local public employes and their dependents or beneficiaries in meeting the financial burdens so often associated with old age, disability, death, illness and accident. The assets of the funds are not assets of the state but are held in trust pending their disbursement to secure insurance or social security coverage for, or to pay benefits directly to, participants or their beneficiaries.

These trusts were created to serve the public interest by assisting state agencies and local governments, as employers, in achieving the following objectives:

- Providing for orderly and humane departure from service of employes no longer able to perform their duties effectively
- Enhancement of employe morale and productivity
- Recruitment and retention of competent employes
- Establishment of equitable benefit standards throughout public employment
- Facilitating transfer of personnel between public employers
- Achieving the administrative expense savings which derive from not having to administer a multitude of local and/or state benefit plans for different employers and employe groups

The following pages illustrate in statistical and financial terms the scope and growth of the various benefit plans, the progress made and the department's objectives for the future.
