Enclosed is a copy of a State Affirmative Action Council report showing the effects of recent layoffs of state employes on members of affirmative action groups (women, ethnic/racial minorities and persons with handicaps). The council is statutorily responsible for monitoring affirmative action in state employment.

The report shows that, overall, affirmative action group members were not adversely affected by actual unemployment due to layoff. However, ethnic/racial minorities and persons with handicaps were forced to take demotions in lieu of layoff at rates greater than their incidence in the workforce.

The Council plans to update this report early in 1982.
