“Move that the Senate and Assembly shall adjourn the spring floor period on April 2, 1982, as established by **Senate Joint Resolution 1** and in accordance with Joint Rule 83(4), any bill or joint resolution not yet agreed to by both houses, and any resolution not yet passed by the house of origin, shall be deemed adversely disposed of for the biennial session and recorded as 'failed to pass', 'failed to adopt', or 'failed to concur', with the exception of **Senate Bill 783**, **Senate Joint Resolution 62**, and the general subject of reapportionment of legislative districts, including **Senate Bill 712** and the report of the Committee on Conference appointed under **Assembly Joint Resolution 103** and that in accordance with Joint

Rule 81 (2), the Legislature shall extend Floorperiod IV for the sole purpose of considering and acting upon the legislative business excepted from the provisions of Joint Rule 83(4) stated above."

**To the Honorable the Senate:**

In trying to estimate appropriations and revenues for the next biennium, many assumptions have been made and in all cases the assumptions are my personal view of the future. As Bob Lang states in his March 1, 1982 paper on "Future General Fund Revenue and Appropriation Growth", "the business of estimating the 1983-85 revenues is not possible." I would add to his statement that the only certainty is that these estimates will be wrong. All my assumptions and estimates were made with the hope that expenditures can and will be controlled in the next biennium.

In answer to the questions posed:

1. Q. What assumptions were used regarding the base level appropriations for the 1983-85 projections?

A. The base levels used are the 1982-83 appropriations of Senate Bill 783.

2. Q. Are the 8% across-the-board reductions in Chapter 20, Laws of 1981, and the 4% across-the-board reductions proposed in Senate Bill 783 restored or not restored in 1983-85?

A. They are not restored.

3. Q. Is the pending 4% cut in the University System included or not included in this projection?

A. It is included.

4. Q. What assumptions were used regarding the shared revenue base level for 1983-85?

A. As indicated in my March 26 letter to the co-chairs of the Joint Committee on Finance, I used \$638 million as the base. I also assumed that the tax dollars committed to solving the deficit not be considered as permanent revenue growth for purposes of calculating the base for shared revenues.

5. Q. What assumptions were used regarding the rate of growth in the shared revenue appropriation for the 1983-85 biennium?

A. The 1983-85 biennial growth from 1982-83 is estimated to be 35.2%. The growth for 1983-84 is 11.5% and for 1984-85 it was estimated at 11%.

6. Q. What cost ratio and assumptions were used to calculate state general school aids for 1983-85?

A. No cost ratios were projected, but I made the assumption that school aids would grow 7% each year for the 1983-85 biennium as compared to the base year 1982-83.

7. Q. What assumption was used to calculate aids to VTAE districts for this period?

A. I assumed the aids would hold constant.

8. Q. What is the administration's pay plan estimate for 1983-85? What are the fringe benefit factors?

A. I thought it clearly inappropriate to set any pay plan or fringe benefit figures that far in advance of the start of the collective bargaining process. No dollar amount was used in the fund condition statement for either year. Clearly, the fund condition statement indicates there is money for an increase in 1984-85, but in order to give an increase in 1983-84, priorities would have to be reviewed and other budget adjustments made. It does seem reasonable to presume that wage increases should be somehow related to the fiscal condition of the state and its people.

9. Q. What increases (or reductions) are anticipated in human services?

A. I did not deal with totals for all of Human Services. However, I did include the agreed upon pick up of SSI. The increase over the 1982-83 base is 17.4% the first year and 11.5% the second.

10. Q. Are potential federal aid reductions in these programs included or excluded?

A. Potential federal aid reductions were excluded. It was my feeling that the level of confidence of these estimates was such that I did not want to introduce an unknown variable.

11. Q. What rates of increase (or reduction) are assumed for AFDC?

A. 12.5% for 1983-84 and 7.7% for 1984-85 (increases).

12. Q. What rates of increase (or reduction) are assumed for Medical Assistance?

A. 18.5% for 1983-84 and an additional 13.2% for 1984-85 (increases).

13. Q. What rates of increase (or reduction) are assumed for Community Aids?

A. 4% for 1983-84 and 5% for 1984-85 (increases).

14. Q. Which programs will require statutory modification to achieve the appropriation level desired?

A. No statutory modifications of Human Services programs were assumed excepting normal changes to reflect increased benefits for income maintenance programs.

15. Q. What assumptions were used in estimating debt service?

A. No new assumptions were used to estimate debt service. We did assume a 12% interest rate on our bonds.

16. Q. Is debt service on the additional bond authorization in Senate Bill 783 included or excluded from this estimate?

A. The authorizations in Senate Bill 783 were included in estimating debt service. Thus, if these buildings are delayed by the building committee, my estimates for debt service will be too high.

17. Q. What assumptions are made regarding Homestead expenditures for 1983-85?

A. I assumed no changes in the program.

18. Q. Does the administration's revenue growth assumption of 11% per year for the 1983-85 biennium include or exclude the effects of the recently enacted federal accelerated depreciation schedule, the phase in of federal treatment of capital gains, and provisions for indexing the income tax?

A. I included all the items listed.

I hope this is responsive to your request.

To the Honorable the Senate:

On behalf of the Natural Resources Board, I am transmitting to you a report prepared by the Department of Natural Resources which evaluates the first three years of the Wisconsin Nonpoint Source Water Pollution Abatement Program. The report is submitted in fulfillment of the request made in Section 923(37)(b), Chapter 418, Laws of 1977. A copy of this report is also being transmitted under separate cover to Governor Lee Sherman Dreyfus.

The Natural Resources Board approved the report and the recommendations made in the report at its February 25, 1982 meeting. The report has been extensively reviewed by two water

quality advisory committees and other interested groups and individuals. A summary of these review comments are included as Appendix I to the report.

While the recommendations contained in the report do not require immediate Legislative action, I would like to highlight several points which the Legislature should consider in future decisions that affect the Nonpoint Source Program. Of major importance is the fact that nonpoint sources are currently affecting a significant number of valuable water resources. For example, over 3,500 miles of Class I and II trout streams (constituting approximately 40 percent of the state total), over 1,600 miles of smallmouth bass streams (50 percent of the state total) and about 120 deep lakes are located in a U-shape area of the state where the potential for nonpoint source pollution has been determined to be most critical. Point sources of pollution generally do not affect these waters. Since the Nonpoint Source Program has been shown to be an effective means of controlling nonpoint sources in critical areas, it is important to make every effort to continue the orderly and systematic growth of the program according to the 25 year implementation strategy recommended in the report.

The Department of Natural Resources will provide future reports to the Legislature and Governor as critical stages of the program's ongoing projects are completed.
