A Proclamation

I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and Section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do hereby require the convening of a special session of the Legislature to take place at the Capitol in Madison on the Fourth day of January, A.D., 1983, at 10:00 A.M., solely for the purpose of considering and acting upon the following specific legislative business, to-wit:

- 1. To prevent the reversion of the sales and use tax rate to 4% and to make permanent the sales and use tax rate of 5%, and to repeal the requirement of amendment of the constitution to permit a permanent 5% sales and use tax rate.
- 2. To prevent the reversion of the tax on cigarettes to the rate existing prior to May 1, 1982 and to make permanent the current rate of the tax on cigarettes.
- 3. To eliminate certain of the payments provided for by Sections 79.10(6), (7) and (8) of the statutes.
- 4. To authorize the Governor to call a special primary and election to coincide with the 1983 spring primary and election to fill a vacancy in the 12th Senate district.
