A Proclamation

I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and Section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do hereby amend the purpose for which the Legislature was convened in special session at the Capitol in Madison on the Fourth day of January, A.D., 1983, at 10:00 A.M., by adding the following specific pieces of legislative business, to-wit:

1. To authorize the Governor to extend the deadline of January 25, 1983 for the introduction of the 1983-85 executive budget bill to no later than February 8, 1983.
