The Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems is concerned only with those provisions in the budget legislation dealing with public retirement matters. The committee recommends that the provisions authorizing investment of retirement fund assets in venture capital be deleted and introduced as separate legislation. With this recommendation, the committee finds that the sections in Senate Bill 83 and the senate substitute amendment 1 thereto relating to public retirement matters are good public policy, and the committee recommends passage of those provisions as found in senate substitute amendment 1 to Senate Bill 83.
