A Proclamation

- I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article IV, Section Eleven Article V, Section Four of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do hereby require the convening of a special session of the Legislature to take place at the Capitol in the City of Madison on the eleventh day of July, A.D., 1983, at 1:30 P.M., solely for the purpose of considering and acting upon the following legislative business:
 - 1. Enacting a plan of senate and assembly districts and other revisions relating to legislative districts and re-districting.
 - 2. Creating a Tax Incremental Finance Joint Review Board with the purpose of reviewing creation of Tax Incremental Finance districts.
