The amendment introduced by the Senator from the 7th, Senator Kleczka, would limit the state's jurisdiction over in-state publishers. The amendment relates to a different subject and would expand the scope of the bill, alter the nature of the original proposal and would accomplish a different purpose. Therefore, it is the opinion of the chair the amendment is not germane and the point of order is well taken.
