Therefore it is the opinion of the chair that senate amendment 1 relates to a different specific subject than that of Assembly Bill 217 and in accordance with Senate Rule 50(7), the amendment is not germane and the point of order raised by the Senator of the 21st, Senator Strohl, is well taken.
