The senate was called to order by Fred A. Risser, president of the senate.

A Proclamation

I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on May 22, 1984 at 10:00 A.M. solely to consider and act upon the following specific legislative business:

1. Authorizing and regulating group deer hunting.

2. Establishing an allocation system for the financial assistance program for septic system replacement and rehabilitation, revising the definition of small commercial establishment under the program, requiring that government units adopt maintenance programs in order to receive grant funds, imposing the requirement of a written enforcement order as a condition of eligibility for grant funds, establishing a maximum state share for any project and requiring government units to adopt a system for equitable distribution of grant funds.

3. Requiring the Department of Health and Social Services to inspect nursing home payroll records in order to verify staffing requirements.

4. Considering the confirmation of several gubernatorial appointees.

5. Authorizing grants from the Technology Development Fund to be made to companies headquartered out of state.

6. Restoring the full definition of "domestic abuse" to 1983 Wisconsin Act 204 and adding a cross reference to a penalty to 1983 Wisconsin Act 438.
