A Proclamation

I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do amend Executive Order 55, requiring the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on May 22, 1984 at 10:00 A.M. by adding to its business considering and acting upon the following specific legislative business:

1. To authorize and direct expenditure of \$25,000 from the general fund for payment of a claim against the state made by Elwin C. Donaldson.

2. Disallowing shared revenue adjustments for 1984 due to corrections resulting from the incorrect inclusion of auditorium revenues in local purpose revenues.

3. Changing the method of election of party committeemen in municipalities having a population of more than 7,500.
