Pursuant to 1983 Wisconsin Act 470 and Chapter 69, 31 United States Code, relating to payment in lieu of taxes (PILT) on federal lands, I am designating the Department of Natural Resources as the administering agency of the PILT program.

Federal law allows states to designate a state agency to administer federal payments in lieu of taxes for federal lands (including national forests, national parks and fish and wildlife areas). The 1983 Wisconsin Act 470 created section 16.54(11) of the statutes which requires the Governor to exercise the option and designate a state board, commission or department to administer federal payments in lieu of taxes on national forest lands to towns, cities and villages -- but not to counties -- that contain national forest lands.

The act first applies to funds received from the federal government on the day after the effective date of Act 470 (May 18, 1984).

The Department of Natural Resources must notify the secretary of the U.S. Department of the Interior of the designation within 30 days after the designation and submit proposed rules interpreting section 16.54(11) of the statutes by August 16, 1984, 90 days after the effective date of the Act.

Administration of the PILT program will require assembling the necessary data on the number of entitlement acres in each town containing national forests, and the number of entitlement acres in each county containing other entitlement lands such as national parks, fish and wildlife areas and others. The nature of the PILT program requires that the designated state agency receive and administer PILT funds for all types of entitlement lands in Wisconsin, even though state law only specifies PILT for national forest lands. Thus, the agency must distribute PILT for national forest

lands to towns, but may continue to distribute PILT for other federal lands to counties.

The state has the responsibility for distributing the funds according to the amount of local government services provided by entitled units, and the amount of entitlement acreage within the local unit's jurisdiction.
