State of Wisconsin Land Conservation Board

October 1, 1984

To the Honorable the Legislature

This report on soil erosion has been prepared by the Land Conservation Board as required by 1983 Wisconsin Act 416. This law requires the Land Conservation Board to study the nature and extent of soil erosion in Wisconsin, and to report findings and recommendations to the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection; the Governor and the presiding officers of each house of the Legislature for referral to the appropriate standing committees prior to October 1, 1984.

Soil erosion, especially crop erosion, is a serious problem in Wisconsin and it appears to be getting worse. We believe the recommendations presented in this report form a resolute and balanced approach to dealing with soil erosion, and we urge their adoption.
