Dear Speaker Loftus:

This letter is to inform you that I am appointing a subcommittee of the Committee on Agriculture to investigate what additional steps, if any, are necessary to control swine pseudorabies.

The seriousness of this disease was initially recognized by the Legislature's enactment of 1983 Wisconsin Act 132, which established a pseudorabies surveillance, control and indemnification program. However, it is contended that there are additional steps which the state can take to control this disease. Accordingly, the subcommittee is charged with reviewing the current program and recommending any changes deemed necessary or desirable.

Representative Barbara Gronemus, Vice-Chairperson of the Committee on Agriculture, will serve as Chairperson of the Subcommittee on Swine Pseudorabies. Representatives Donald Hasenohrl and Joseph Tregoning are the other members of the Subcommittee. The Subcommittee has been directed to complete its work by August 15, 1985.
