EXECUTIVE COMMUNICATIONS

Executive Order Number 82

I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and

Section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do amend as follows Executive Order 81, dated September 24, 1985, requiring the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on September 24, 1985 at 10:00 a.m.:

- Paragraph 1 is amended to read: Creating a ninemember strategic planning council to examine long-term economic issues and advise the governor and the legislature and making an appropriation for such a council;
- Paragraph 2 is amended to read: Increasing the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) permit coordination staff and creating the position of Special Assistant to the Secretary to direct that staff and requiring the DNR to designate a business liaison in each district and increasing an appropriation for the DNR;
- Paragraph 3 is amended to read: Establishing procedures within the DNR for the testing, inspection and exemption from regulation of certain high volume and low hazard wastes;
- 4. Paragraph 4 is amended to read: Permitting recovery in certain cases of legal costs by a small business, non-profit organization, or individual, which prevails in an administrative contested case or in a legal action by a state agency;
- 5. Paragraph 5 is amended to read: Establishing procedures to regulate <u>major withdrawals</u> from Wisconsin waters;
- 6. Paragraph 6 is amended to read: Requiring the State Investment Board to establish an investment plan for investing in Wisconsin;
- 7. Paragraph 16 is amended to read: Making certain changes in the determination of the value and equalized value of agricultural land, information required to be included on the real estate transfer form and requiring the Department of Revenue to promulgate rules and making appropriations;
- 8. Paragraph 17 is amended to read: Permitting utilities to diversify for certain purposes, limited to a fixed percentage of the utility's equity or assets.
