A Proclamation

I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin. do require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on March 19, 1985 at 10:00 A.M. solely to consider and act upon the following specific legislative business:

> 1. Appropriation of funds to the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection to assist the federal Department of Agriculture in the operation of emergency loan processing centers.

> 2. Establishment of a general purpose revenue fund to support the animal waste pollution grant program, limit the purposes of grants under that program, allow counties participating in the program to use funds for administrative and technical expenses, and exempting certain runoff control structures from the limit on grants to any one farmer.

> 3. Appropriation of funds to the Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority provide agricultural production loan to guarantees and interest reductions on guaranteed agricultural loans.
